- 5. How did leading thinkers of the time argue against witchcraft persecution and with what results?
- 6. What role do you think misogyny played in the witchcraft phenomena? What other motivations do you think accusers might have had?
- 7. Why did the witch trials come to an end? What was the primary factor involved?
